


10 Facts About Butterflies

A light blue butterfly with white spots on its wings, positioned behind the text box.


Butterflies flap their wings about five times every second


There are around 28,000 species of butterflies in the world


Butterflies use the antennae on their head to feel, hear & smell


They start life as an egg before changing into a caterpillar, then butterfly


The average lifespan of a butterfly is between 3 days & 11 months


Female butterflies are bigger and live longer than males
